SECTION B. Project Description

Purdue University proposes to analytically investigation the behavior and strength of modular steel-plate composite (SC) slabs and floor systems, analytically investigate the behavior and performance of SC structures subjected to impulsive loading including blast effects, experimentally verify the findings of analytical investigations, and develop design recommendations and guidelines for SC slabs and for SC structures subjected to impulsive loading.

SECTION C. Environmental Aspects / Potential Sources of Impact

The research would involve assessing modular steel-plate composite performance. The action would not create additional environmental impacts above those already occurring at the university and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ERDC blast load simulator facility.

SECTION D. Determine the Level of Environmental Review (or Documentation) and Reference(s): Identify the applicable categorical exclusion from 10 CFR 1021, Appendix B, give the appropriate justification, and the approval date.
