This is in final response from the Idaho Operations Office (DOE-ID), regarding your June 2, 2010, Freedom of Information Act Request. In that e-mail you requested documents relating to: "vulnerabilities of running desktop applications (Word, Excel, and PowerPoint) on the same platform as the process control systems applications."

The administrator for DOE-ID's Critical Infrastructure Program was contacted to locate any relevant documents in his possession or his contractor counterpart.
